PREMIUMS AND PREMIUM PAYMENT

The Policyholder agrees to remit the premium for each Insured Person to the Company or its authorized agent within 20 days after the receipt of the premium. The Company will have the right to examine all of the Policyholder's books and records relating to this policy at any time up to the later of 1) two years after the termination of this policy and 2) the date of final adjustment and settlement of all claims under this policy.

Illinois Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association: Summary of General Purposes and Current Limitations of Coverage

The following contains a brief summary of the Illinois Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association Law's coverages, exclusions, and limits. This summary does not cover all provisions, nor does it in any way change anyone's rights or obligations under the Law or the rights or obligations of the Guaranty Association. If you have obtained this document from an agent in connection with the purchase of a policy, you should be aware that its delivery to you does not guarantee that your policy is covered by the Guaranty Association.

A) Coverage:

The Illinois Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association provides coverage to policyholders that reside in Illinois for insurance issued by members of the Guaranty Association, including:

1. life insurance, health insurance, and annuity contracts;
2. life, health or annuity certificates under direct group policies or contracts;
3. unallocated annuity contracts; and
4. contracts to furnish health care services and subscription certificates for medical or health care services issued by certain licensed entities. The beneficiaries, payees, or assignees of such person are also protected, even if they live in another state.

B) Exclusions from Coverage:

1. The Guaranty Association does not provide coverage for:
 - a. any policy or portion of a policy for which the individual has assumed the risk;
 - b. any policy of reinsurance (unless an assumption certificate was issued);
 - c. interest rate guarantees which exceed certain statutory limitations;

(following items d., e., and f. which are not applicable to health insurance)
2. In addition, persons are not protected by the Guaranty Association if:
 - a. the Illinois Director of Insurance determines that, in the case of an insurer which is not domiciled in Illinois, the insurer's home state provides substantially similar protection to Illinois residents which will be provided in a timely manner; or
 - b. their policy was issued by an organization which is not a member insurer of the Association.

C) Limits on Amount of Coverage:

1. The law also limits the amount the Illinois Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association is obligated to pay. The Guaranty Association's liability is limited to the lesser of either:
 - a. the contractual obligations for which the insurer is liable or for which the insurer would have been liable if it were not an impaired or insolvent insurer; or
 - b. with respect to any one life, regardless of the number of policies, contracts or certificates:
 - i. *(not applicable to health insurance)*; and
 - ii. in the case of health insurance, \$300,000 in health insurance benefits, including net cash surrender or withdrawal values; and
 - iii. *(not applicable to health insurance)*.
2. However, in no event is the Guaranty Association liable for more than \$300,000 with respect to any one individual.

DISCLOSURE OF LIMITED BENEFIT

WARNING, LIMITED BENEFITS WILL BE PAID WHEN NON-PARTICIPATING PROVIDERS ARE USED.

You should be aware that when you elect to utilize the services of a non-participating provider for a covered service in non-emergency situations, benefit payments to such non-participating provider are not based upon the amount billed. The basis of your benefit payment will be determined according to your policy's fee schedule, usual and customary charge (which is determined by comparing charges for similar services adjusted to the geographical area where the services are performed), or other method as defined by the policy.

YOU CAN EXPECT TO PAY MORE THAN THE COINSURANCE AMOUNT DEFINED IN THE POLICY AFTER THE PLAN HAS PAID ITS REQUIRED PORTION.

Non-participating providers may bill members for any amount up to the billed charge after the plan has paid its portion of the bill. Participating providers have agreed to accept discounted payments for services with no additional billing to the member other than co-insurance and deductible amounts. You may obtain further information about the participating status of professional providers and information on out-of-pocket expenses by calling the toll free telephone number on your identification card.

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**PART I
ELIGIBILITY AND TERMINATION PROVISIONS**

Eligibility: Each person who belongs to one of the "Classes of Persons To Be Insured" as set forth in the application is eligible to be insured under this policy. The Named Insured must actively attend classes for at least the first 31 days after the date for which coverage is purchased. Home study, correspondence, Internet, and television (TV) courses do not fulfill the eligibility requirements that the Named Insured actively attend classes. The Company maintains its right to investigate eligibility or student status and attendance records to verify that the policy eligibility requirements have been met. If and whenever the Company discovers that the policy eligibility requirements have not been met, its only obligation is refund of premium.

The eligibility date for Dependents of the Named Insured (as defined) shall be determined in accordance with the following:

- 1) If a Named Insured has Dependents on the date he or she is eligible for insurance; or
- 2) If a Named Insured acquires a Dependent after the Effective Date, such Dependent becomes eligible:
 - (a) On the date the Named Insured marries the Dependent; or
 - (b) On the date the Named Insured acquires a dependent child who is within the limits of a dependent, unmarried child set forth in the "Definitions" section of this policy.

Dependent eligibility expires concurrently with that of the Named Insured.

Eligible persons may be insured under this policy subject to the following:

- 1) Payment of premium as set forth on the policy application; and,
- 2) Application to the Company for such coverage.

Effective Date: Insurance under this policy shall become effective on the later of the following dates:

- 1) The Effective Date of the policy; or
- 2) The date premium is received by the Administrator.

Dependent coverage will not be effective prior to that of the Named Insured.

Termination Date: The coverage provided with respect to the Named Insured shall terminate on the earliest of the following dates:

- 1) The last day of the period through which the premium is paid; or
- 2) The date the policy terminates.

The coverage provided with respect to any Dependent shall terminate on the earliest of the following dates:

- 1) The last day of the period through which the premium is paid;
- 2) The date the policy terminates; or
- 3) The date the Named Insured's coverage terminates.

**PART II
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

ENTIRE CONTRACT CHANGES: This policy, including the endorsements and attached papers, if any, and the application of the Policyholder shall constitute the entire contract between the parties. No agent has authority to change this policy or to waive any of its provisions. No change in the policy shall be valid until approved by an executive officer of the Company and unless such approval be endorsed hereon or attached hereto. Such an endorsement or attachment shall be effective without the consent of the Insured Person but shall be without prejudice to any claim arising prior to its Effective Date.

GENERAL PROVISIONS (Continued)

GRACE PERIOD: A grace period of 10 days for monthly premiums policies and 31 days for all other policies will be granted for the payment of each premium falling due after the first premium, during which grace period the policy shall continue in force.

PAYMENT OF PREMIUM: All premiums are payable in advance for each policy term in accordance with the Company's premium rates. The full premium must be paid even if the premium is received after the policy Effective Date. There is no pro-rata or reduced premium payment for late enrollees. There will be no refunds to students who cancel coverage under the policy; unless the Insured enters the armed forces.

Premium adjustments involving return of unearned premiums to the Policyholder will be limited to a period of 12 months immediately preceding the date of receipt by the Company of evidence that adjustments should be made. Premiums are payable to the Company, P.O. Box 809026, Dallas, Texas 75380-9026.

NOTICE OF CLAIM: Written notice of claim must be given to the Company within 90 days after the occurrence or commencement of any loss covered by this policy, or as soon thereafter as is reasonably possible. Notice given by or on behalf of the Named Insured to the Company, P.O. Box 809025, Dallas, Texas 75380-9025 with information sufficient to identify the Named Insured shall be deemed notice to the Company.

CLAIM FORMS: Claim forms are not required.

PROOF OF LOSS: Written proof of loss must be furnished to the Company at its said office within 90 days after the date of such loss. Failure to furnish such proof within the time required will not invalidate nor reduce any claim if it was not reasonably possible to furnish proof. In no event except in the absence of legal capacity shall written proofs of loss be furnished later than one year from the time proof is otherwise required.

TIME OF PAYMENT OF CLAIMS: Indemnities payable under this policy for any loss will be paid upon receipt of due written proof of such loss. All claims and indemnities payable under the terms of this policy of accident and health insurance shall be paid within 30 days following receipt by the Company of due proof of loss. Failure to pay within such period shall entitle the Insured to interest at the rate of nine percent per annum from the 30th day after receipt of such proof of loss to the date of late payment, provided that interest amounting to less than one dollar need not be paid.

PAYMENT OF CLAIMS: All or a portion of any indemnities provided by this policy may, at the Company's option, and unless the Named Insured requests otherwise in writing not later than the time of filing proofs of such loss, be paid directly to the Hospital or person rendering such service. Otherwise, accrued indemnities will be paid to the Named Insured or the estate of the Named Insured. Any payment so made shall discharge the Company's obligation to the extent of the amount of benefits so paid.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: As a part of Proof of Loss, the Company at its own expense shall have the right and opportunity: 1) to examine the person of any Insured Person when and as often as it may reasonably require during the pendency of a claim; and, 2) to have an autopsy made in case of death where it is not forbidden by law. The Company has the right to secure a second opinion regarding treatment or hospitalization. Failure of an Insured to present himself or herself for examination by a Physician when requested shall authorize the Company to: (1) withhold any payment of Covered Medical Expenses until such examination is performed and Physician's report received; and (2) deduct from any amounts otherwise payable hereunder any amount for which the Company has become obligated to pay to a Physician retained by the Company to make an examination for which the Insured failed to appear. Said deduction shall be made with the same force and effect as a Deductible herein defined.

LEGAL ACTIONS: No action at law or in equity shall be brought to recover on this policy prior to the expiration of 60 days after written proofs of loss have been furnished in accordance with the requirements of this policy. No such action shall be brought after the expiration of 3 years after the time written proofs of loss are required to be furnished.

GENERAL PROVISIONS (Continued)

SUBROGATION: Whenever this policy has paid benefits because of Sickness or an Injury to any Insured Person resulting from a third party's wrongful act or negligence, to the extent of such payment the Company shall reserve the right to assume the legal claim any Insured Person may have against that third party. This means that the Company may choose to take legal action against the negligent third party or their representatives and to recover from them the amount of claim benefits paid to the Insured Person for loss caused by the third party.

RIGHT OF REIMBURSEMENT: If an Insured Person incurs expenses for Sickness or an Injury that occurred due to the negligence of a third party:

- A) The Company has the right to reimbursement for all benefits paid by the Company from any and all damages collected from the third party for those same expenses whether by action at law, settlement, or compromise, by the Insured Person, Insured Person's parents, if the Insured Person is a minor, or Insured Person's legal representative as a result of that Sickness or Injury.
- B) The Company is assigned the right to recover from the third party, or his or her insurer, to the extent of the benefits paid by the Company for that Sickness or Injury.

The Company has the right to reimbursement out of all funds the Insured Person, the Insured Person's parents, if the Insured Person is a minor, or the Insured Person's legal representative, is or was able to obtain for the same expenses we have paid as a result of that Sickness or Injury.

You are required to furnish any information or assistance or provide any documents that we may reasonably require in order to obtain our rights under this provision. This provision applies whether or not the third party admits liability.

RIGHT OF RECOVERY: Payments made by the Company which exceed the Covered Medical Expenses (after allowance for Deductible and coinsurance clauses, if any) payable hereunder shall be recoverable by the Company from or among any persons, firms, or corporations to or for whom such payments were made or from any insurance organizations who are obligated in respect of any covered Injury or Sickness as their liability may appear.

MORE THAN ONE POLICY: Insurance effective at any one time on the Insured Person under a like policy, or policies in this Company is limited to the one such policy elected by the Insured Person, his beneficiary or his estate, as the case may be, and the Company will return all premiums paid for all other such policies.

PART III DEFINITIONS

ADOPTED CHILD means the adopted child placed with an Insured while that person is covered under this policy. Such child will be covered from the moment of placement for the first 31 days. The Pre-existing Conditions limitation will not apply to an adoptive child. The Insured must notify the Company, in writing, of the adopted child not more than 31 days after placement or adoption.

In the case of a newborn adopted child, coverage begins at the moment of birth if a written agreement to adopt such child has been entered into by the Insured prior to the birth of the child, whether or not the agreement is enforceable. However, coverage will not continue to be provided for an adopted child who is not ultimately placed in the Insured's residence.

The Insured will have the right to continue such coverage for the child beyond the first 31 days. To continue the coverage the Insured must, within the 31 days after the child's date of placement: 1) apply to us; and 2) pay the required additional premium, if any, for the continued coverage. If the Insured does not use this right as stated here, all coverage as to that child will terminate at the end of the first 31 days after the child's date of placement.

COMPLICATION OF PREGNANCY means a condition: 1) caused by pregnancy; 2) requiring medical treatment prior to, or subsequent to termination of pregnancy; 3) the diagnosis of which is distinct from pregnancy; and 4) which constitutes a classifiably distinct Complication of Pregnancy. A condition simply associated with the management of a difficult pregnancy is not considered a Complication of Pregnancy. The term "Complication of Pregnancy" includes non-elective cesarean section; ectopic pregnancy which is terminated; spontaneous termination of pregnancy which occurs during a period of gestation in which a viable birth is not possible; and, pre-eclampsia.

DEFINITIONS (Continued)

COVERED MEDICAL EXPENSES means reasonable charges which are: 1) not in excess of Usual and Customary Charges; 2) not in excess of the maximum benefit amount payable per service as specified in the Schedule of Benefits; 3) made for services and supplies not excluded under the policy; 4) made for services and supplies which are a Medical Necessity; 5) made for services included in the Schedule of Benefits; and 6) in excess of the amount stated as a Deductible, if any.

Covered Medical Expenses will be deemed "incurred" only: 1) when the covered services are provided; and 2) when a charge is made to the Insured Person for such services.

DEDUCTIBLE means if an amount is stated in the Schedule of Benefits or any endorsement to this policy as a deductible, it shall mean an amount to be subtracted from the amount or amounts otherwise payable as Covered Medical Expenses before payment of any benefit is made. The deductible will apply per policy year or per occurrence (for each Injury or Sickness) as specified in the Schedule of Benefits.

DEPENDENT means a Named Insured's spouse (husband or wife) or Domestic Partner and any unmarried child: (1) from birth to age 19 including an adopted child, a child who lives with the Insured from the time of the filing of a petition for adoption, a stepchild or recognized child who lives with the Insured in a parent-child relationship, or a child who lives with the Insured if such Insured is a court appointed guardian of the child; or (2) age 19 to 23 if enrolled as a full-time student in any accredited school, financially dependent upon the Insured. Dependent also includes any child under age 18 for which the Named Insured is under court order to provide medical coverage.

The Company may inquire of the Named Insured 2 months prior to attainment by a Dependent of the limiting age set forth in the policy, or at any reasonable time thereafter, whether such Dependent is in fact a disabled and dependent person and, in the absence of proof submitted within 60 days of such inquiry that such Dependent is a disabled and dependent person may terminate coverage of such person at or after attainment of the limiting age. In the absence of such inquiry, coverage of any disabled and dependent person shall continue through the term of such policy or any extension or renewal thereof.

DOMESTIC PARTNER means a person who is neither married nor related by blood or marriage to the Named Insured but who is: 1) the Named Insured's sole spousal equivalent; 2) lives together with the Named Insured in the same residence and intends to do so indefinitely; and 3) is responsible with the Named Insured for each other's welfare. A domestic partner relationship may be demonstrated by any three of the following types of documentation: 1) a joint mortgage or lease; 2) designation of the domestic partner as beneficiary for life insurance; 3) designation of the domestic partner as primary beneficiary in the Named Insured's will; 4) domestic partnership agreement; 5) powers of attorney for property and/or health care; and 6) joint ownership of either a motor vehicle, checking account or credit account.

ELECTIVE SURGERY OR ELECTIVE TREATMENT means those health care services or supplies that do not meet the health care need for a Sickness or Injury. Elective surgery or elective treatment includes any service, treatment or supplies that: 1) are deemed by the Company to be research or experimental; or 2) are not recognized and generally accepted medical practices in the United States.

EXPERIMENTAL TREATMENT means medical technology or a new application of existing medical technology, including medical procedures, drugs, and devices for treating a medical condition, illness, or diagnosis that: 1) is not generally accepted by informed health care professionals in the United States as effective; or 2) has not been proven by scientific testing or evidence to be effective.

HOSPITAL means a licensed or properly accredited general hospital which: 1) is open at all times; 2) is operated primarily and continuously for the treatment of and surgery for sick and injured persons as inpatients; 3) is under the supervision of a staff of one or more legally qualified Physicians available at all times; 4) continuously provides on the premises 24 hour nursing service by Registered Nurses; 5) provides organized facilities for diagnosis and major surgery on the premises or in facilities available to the Hospital on a pre-arranged basis; and 6) is not primarily a clinic, nursing, rest or convalescent home, or an institution specializing in or primarily treating Mental and Nervous Disorder. The requirement for major surgery facilities does not apply to treatment or services for rehabilitation or mental illness rendered in a hospital.

HOSPITAL CONFINED/HOSPITAL CONFINEMENT means confined in a Hospital for at least 18 hours by reason of an Injury or Sickness for which benefits are payable.

DEFINITIONS (Continued)

INJURY means bodily injury which is: 1) the direct cause of loss, independent of disease cause of loss, independent of disease or bodily infirmity; 2) a source of loss; 3) treated by a Physician within 30 days after the date of accident; and 4) sustained while the Insured Person is covered under this policy. All injuries sustained in one accident, including all related conditions and recurrent symptoms of these injuries will be considered one injury. Covered Medical Expenses incurred as a result of an injury that occurred prior to this policy's Effective Date will be considered a Sickness under this policy.

INSURED PERSON means: 1) the Named Insured; and, 2) Dependents of the Named Insured, if: 1) the Dependent is properly enrolled in the program, and 2) the appropriate Dependent premium has been paid. The term "Insured" also means Insured Person.

INTENSIVE CARE means: 1) a specifically designated facility of the Hospital that provides the highest level of medical care; and 2) which is restricted to those patients who are critically ill or injured. Such facility must be separate and apart from the surgical recovery room and from rooms, beds and wards customarily used for patient confinement. They must be: 1) permanently equipped with special life-saving equipment for the care of the critically ill or injured; and 2) under constant and continuous observation by nursing staff assigned on a full-time basis, exclusively to the intensive care unit. Intensive care does not mean any of these step-down units:

- 1) Progressive care;
- 2) Sub-acute intensive care;
- 3) Intermediate care units;
- 4) Private monitored rooms;
- 5) Observation units; or
- 6) Other facilities which do not meet the standards for intensive care.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY means the occurrence of a sudden, serious and unexpected Sickness or Injury. In the absence of immediate medical attention, a reasonable person could believe this condition would result in:

- 1) Death;
- 2) Placement of the Insured's health in jeopardy;
- 3) Serious impairment of bodily functions;
- 4) Serious dysfunction of any body organ or part; or
- 5) In the case of a pregnant woman, serious jeopardy to the health of the fetus.

Expenses incurred for "Medical Emergency" will be paid only for Sickness or Injury which fulfills the above conditions. These expenses will not be paid for minor Injuries or minor Sicknesses.

MEDICAL NECESSITY means those services or supplies provided or prescribed by a Hospital or Physician which are:

- 1) Essential for the symptoms and diagnosis or treatment of the Sickness or Injury;
- 2) Provided for the diagnosis, or the direct care and treatment of the Sickness or Injury;
- 3) In accordance with the standards of good medical practice;
- 4) Not primarily for the convenience of the Insured, or the Insured's Physician; and,
- 5) The most appropriate supply or level of service which can safely be provided to the Insured.

The Medical Necessity of being Hospital Confined means that: 1) the Insured requires acute care as a bed patient; and, 2) the Insured cannot receive safe and adequate care as an outpatient.

No benefits will be paid for expenses which are determined not to be a Medical Necessity, including any or all days of Hospital Confinement.

MENTAL AND NERVOUS DISORDER means a Sickness that is a mental, emotional or behavioral disorder. If not excluded or defined elsewhere in the policy, all diagnoses classified as a "Mental Disorder" according to the (International Classification of Diseases) are considered one Sickness.

DEFINITIONS *(Continued)*

NAMED INSURED means an eligible, registered student of the Policyholder, if: 1) the student is properly enrolled in the program; and 2) the appropriate premium for coverage has been paid.

NEGATIVE X-RAY means an X-ray that shows the absence of a fracture; pathology; or disease.

NEWBORN INFANT means any child born of an Insured while that person is insured under this policy. Newborn Infants will be covered under the policy for the first 31 days after birth. Coverage for such a child will be for Injury or Sickness, including medically diagnosed congenital defects, birth abnormalities, prematurity and nursery care; benefits will be the same as for the Insured Person who is the child's parent.

The Insured will have the right to continue such coverage for the child beyond the first 31 days. To continue the coverage the Insured must, within the 31 days after the child's birth: 1) apply to us; and 2) pay the required additional premium, if any, for the continued coverage. If the Insured does not use this right as stated here, all coverage as to that child will terminate at the end of the first 31 days after the child's birth.

PHYSICIAN means a legally qualified licensed practitioner of the healing arts who provides care within the scope of his/her license, other than a member of the person's immediate family.

The term "member of the immediate family" means any person related to an Insured Person within the third degree by the laws of consanguinity or affinity.

PHYSIOTHERAPY means any form of the following: physical or mechanical therapy; diathermy; ultra-sonic therapy; heat treatment in any form; manipulation or massage administered by a Physician.

POSITIVE X-RAY means an X-ray that shows the presence of a fracture; pathology; or disease.

PRE-EXISTING CONDITION means: 1) the existence of symptoms which would cause an ordinarily prudent person to seek diagnosis, care or treatment within the 12 months immediately prior to the Insured's Effective Date under the policy; or, 2) any condition which originates, is diagnosed, treated or recommended for treatment within the 12 months immediately prior to the Insured's Effective Date under the policy.

PRESCRIPTION DRUGS means: 1) prescription legend drugs; 2) compound medications of which at least one ingredient is a prescription legend drug; 3) any other drugs which under the applicable state or federal law may be dispensed only upon written prescription of a Physician; and 4) injectable insulin.

PSYCHOTHERAPY means the treatment of a Mental and Nervous Disorder. Psychotherapy includes all related or ancillary charges incurred as a result of a Mental and Nervous Disorder.

REGISTERED NURSE means a professional nurse (R.N.) who is not a member of the Insured Person's immediate family.

SICKNESS means sickness or disease of the Insured Person which causes loss, and originates while the Insured Person is covered under this policy. All related conditions and recurrent symptoms of the same or a similar condition will be considered one sickness. Covered Medical Expenses incurred as a result of an Injury that occurred prior to this policy's Effective Date will be considered a sickness under this policy.

SOUND, NATURAL TEETH means natural teeth, the major portion of the individual tooth is present, regardless of fillings or caps; and is not carious, abscessed, or defective.

USUAL AND CUSTOMARY CHARGES means a reasonable charge which is: 1) usual and customary when compared with the charges made for similar services and supplies; and 2) made to persons having similar medical conditions where service is rendered. No payment will be made under this policy for any expenses incurred which in the judgment of the Company are in excess of Usual and Customary Charges. The definition of Usual and Customary Charges does not apply to charges made by Preferred Providers.

PART IV
EXTENSION OF BENEFITS AFTER TERMINATION

The coverage provided under this policy ceases on the Termination Date. However, if an Insured is Hospital Confined on the Termination Date from a covered Injury or Sickness for which benefits were paid before the Termination Date, Covered Medical Expenses for such Injury or Sickness will continue to be paid as long as the condition continues but not to exceed 90 days after the Termination Date.

The total payments made in respect of the Insured for such condition both before and after the Termination Date will never exceed the Maximum Benefit.

If care is received from a Preferred Provider any Covered Medical Expenses will be paid at the Preferred Provider level of benefits. If the Covered Medical Expense is incurred due to a Medical Emergency, benefits will be paid at the Preferred Provider level of benefits. In all other situations, reduced or lower benefits will be provided when an Out-of-Network provider is used.

NOTE: Prescriptions can be filled by mail order through UHPS pharmacies only. Insured's may get up to a 90 day supply of prescription medication by paying a copay of \$37.50 per prescription for tier 1 or \$62.50 per prescription for tier 2 name drugs. Mail order prescriptions will not be filled less than 45 days from the termination date of the policy.

Pre-existing Condition Exclusion Exception: The Pre-existing Condition exclusion will also apply credit for continuous coverage under a prior health insurance policy if the prior coverage was continuous to a date within 63 days prior to the Insured's Effective Date of coverage under this policy.

Needle Stick / Face Splash as a result of course work will be paid as any other Injury or Sickness.

There is a \$9,750 out of pocket maximum. Once the Insured's out of pocket has reached \$9,750 in Covered Medical Expenses, the Company will pay additional Covered Medical Expenses at 100% of Preferred Allowance and 100 % of Usual & Customary. The out of pocket maximum does not include individual benefit Deductibles. Individual maximums still apply.

The benefits payable are as defined in and subject to all provisions of this policy and any endorsements thereto. Benefits will be paid up to the Maximum Benefit for each service as scheduled below. All benefit maximums are combined Preferred Provider and Out-of-Network, unless noted below.

PREFERRED PROVIDER INFORMATION

“Preferred Providers” are the Physicians, Hospitals and other health care providers who have contracted to provide specific medical care at negotiated prices. Preferred Providers in the local school area are:

UnitedHealthcare Options PPO

The availability of specific providers is subject to change without notice. Insured’s should always confirm that a Preferred Provider is participating at the time services are required by calling the Company at 1-800-767-0700 and/or by asking the provider when making an appointment for services.

“Preferred Allowance” means the amount a Preferred Provider will accept as payment in full for Covered Medical Expenses.

“Out of Network” providers have not agreed to any prearranged fee schedules. Insured’s may incur significant out-of-pocket expenses with these providers. Charges in excess of the insurance payment are the Insured’s responsibility.

Regardless of the provider, each Insured is responsible for the payment of their Deductible. The Deductible must be satisfied before benefits are paid. The Company will pay according to the benefit limits in the Schedule of Benefits.

Inpatient Hospital Expenses

PREFERRED HOSPITALS - Eligible inpatient Hospital expenses at a Preferred Hospital will be paid up to any limits specified in the Schedule of Benefits. Call (800) 767-0700 for information about Preferred Hospitals.

OUT-OF-NETWORK HOSPITALS - If care is provided at a Hospital that is not a Preferred Provider, eligible inpatient Hospital expenses will be paid according to the benefit limits in the Schedule of Benefits.

Outpatient Hospital Expenses

Preferred Providers may discount bills for outpatient Hospital expenses. Benefits are paid according to the Schedule of Benefits. Insured’s are responsible for any amounts that exceed the benefits shown in the Schedule, up to the Preferred Allowance.

Professional & Other Expenses

Benefits for Covered Medical Expenses provided by UnitedHealthcare Options PPO will be paid at the Preferred Allowance up to any limits specified in the Schedule of Benefits. All other providers will be paid according to the benefit limits in the Schedule of Benefits.

PART VI
MEDICAL EXPENSE BENEFITS - INJURY AND SICKNESS

Benefits are payable for Covered Medical Expenses (see "Definitions") less any Deductible incurred by or for an Insured Person for loss due to Injury or Sickness subject to: a) the Maximum Benefit for all services; b) the maximum amount for specific services; both as set forth in the Schedule of Benefits; and c) any coinsurance amount set forth in the Schedule of Benefits or any endorsement hereto. The total payable for all Covered Medical Expenses shall never exceed the Maximum Benefit stated in the Schedule of Benefits. Read the "Definitions" section and the "Exclusions and Limitations" section carefully.

No benefits will be paid for services designated as "No Benefits" in the Schedule of Benefits or for any matter described in "Exclusions and Limitations." If a benefit is designated, Covered Medical Expenses include:

1. **Room and Board Expense:** 1) daily semi-private room rate when Hospital Confined; and 2) general nursing care provided and charged by the Hospital.
2. **Intensive Care:** If provided in the Schedule of Benefits.
3. **Hospital Miscellaneous Expenses:** 1) while Hospital Confined; or 2) as a precondition for being Hospital Confined. Benefits will be paid for services and supplies such as: the cost of the operating room; laboratory tests; X-ray examinations; anesthesia; drugs (excluding take home drugs) or medicines; therapeutic services; and supplies. In computing the number of days payable under this benefit, the date of admission will be counted, but not the date of discharge.
4. **Routine Newborn Care:** 1) while Hospital Confined; and 2) routine nursery care provided immediately after birth. The benefits and the maximum amounts are specified in the Schedule of Benefits.
5. **Physiotherapy (Inpatient):** See Schedule of Benefits.
6. **Surgery:** Physician's fees for inpatient surgery. Payment will be made based upon the surgical schedule as specified in the Schedule of Benefits. If two or more procedures are performed through the same incision or in immediate succession at the same operative session, the maximum amount paid will not exceed 50% of the second procedure and 50% of all subsequent procedures.
7. **Assistant Surgeon Fees:** in connection with inpatient surgery, if provided in the Schedule of Benefits.
8. **Anesthetist Services:** professional services administered in connection with inpatient surgery.
9. **Registered Nurse's Services:** 1) private duty nursing care only; 2) while Hospital Confined; 3) ordered by a licensed Physician; and 4) a Medical Necessity. General nursing care provided by the Hospital is not covered under this benefit.
10. **Physician's Visits:** when Hospital Confined. Benefits are limited to one visit per day. Benefits do not apply when related to surgery. Covered Medical Expenses will be paid under the inpatient benefit or under the outpatient benefit for Physician's Visits, but not both on the same day.
11. **Pre-admission Testing:** limited to routine tests such as: complete blood count; urinalysis; and chest X-rays. If otherwise payable under the policy, major diagnostic procedures such as: cat-scans; NMR's; and blood chemistries will be paid under the "Hospital Miscellaneous" benefit. This benefit is payable within 3 working days prior to admission.
12. **Psychotherapy (Inpatient):** the benefits and the maximum amounts are specified in the Schedule of Benefits and endorsement attached hereto, if so noted in the Schedule of Benefits. Benefits are limited to one visit per day.

13. **Surgery (Outpatient):** Physician's fees for outpatient surgery. Payment will be made based upon the surgical schedule as specified in the Schedule of Benefits. If two or more procedures are performed through the same incision or in immediate succession at the same operative session, the maximum amount paid will not exceed 50% of the second procedure and 50% of all subsequent procedures.
14. **Day Surgery Miscellaneous (Outpatient):** in connection with outpatient day surgery; excluding non-scheduled surgery; and surgery performed in a Hospital emergency room; trauma center; Physician's office; or clinic. Benefits will be paid for services and supplies such as: the cost of the operating room; laboratory tests and X-ray examinations, including professional fees; anesthesia; drugs or medicines; therapeutic services; and supplies.
15. **Assistant Surgeon Fees (Outpatient):** in connection with outpatient surgery, if provided in the Schedule of Benefits.
16. **Anesthetist (Outpatient):** professional services administered in connection with outpatient surgery.
17. **Outpatient Miscellaneous Benefit:** outpatient Hospital and Physician services. Outpatient services payable under this benefit will be designated "Paid under Outpatient Miscellaneous Benefit" in the Schedule of Benefits.
18. **Physician's Visits (Outpatient):** benefits are limited to one visit per day. Benefits do not apply when related to surgery or Physiotherapy. Covered Medical Expenses will be paid under the outpatient benefit or under the inpatient benefit for Physician's Visits, but not both on the same day.
19. **Physiotherapy (Outpatient):** benefits are limited to one visit per day.
20. **Medical Emergency Expenses (Outpatient):** only in connection with a Medical Emergency as defined. Benefits will be paid for the use of the emergency room and supplies. Treatment must be rendered within 72 hours from time of Injury or first onset of Sickness.
21. **Diagnostic X-ray Services (Outpatient):** if so noted in the Schedule of Benefits, separate maximums apply to positive and negative X-rays.
22. **Radiation Therapy (Outpatient):** See Schedule of Benefits.
23. **Laboratory Procedures (Outpatient):** See Schedule of Benefits.
24. **Tests and Procedures (Outpatient):** 1) diagnostic services and medical procedures; 2) performed by a Physician; 3) excluding Physician's Visits; Physiotherapy; X-Rays; and Laboratory Procedures.
25. **Injections (Outpatient):** 1) when administered in the Physician's office; and 2) charged on the Physician's statement.
26. **Chemotherapy (Outpatient):** See Schedule of Benefits.
27. **Prescription Drugs (Outpatient):** See Schedule of Benefits.
28. **Psychotherapy (Outpatient):** the benefits and the maximum amounts are specified in the Schedule of Benefits and endorsement attached hereto, if so noted in the Schedule of Benefits. Benefits are limited to one visit per day.
29. **Ambulance Services:** See Schedule of Benefits.

30. **Durable Medical Equipment:** 1) when prescribed by a Physician; and 2) a written prescription accompanies the claim when submitted. Replacements are never covered. Durable medical equipment includes equipment that: 1) is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical purpose; 2) can withstand repeated use; and 3) generally is not useful to a person in the absence of Injury or Sickness. No benefits will be paid for rental charges in excess of purchase price.
31. **Consultant Physician Fees:** when requested and approved by the attending Physician.
32. **Dental Treatment:** 1) performed by a Physician; and, 2) made necessary by Injury to Sound, Natural Teeth. Breaking a tooth while eating is not covered. Routine dental care and treatment to the gums are not covered.
33. **Alcoholism:** Same as any other Sickness.
34. **Complications of Pregnancy:** Same as any other Sickness.
35. **Repatriation:** if the Insured dies while insured under the policy; benefits will be paid for: 1) preparing; and 2) transporting the remains of the deceased's body to his home country. This benefit is limited to the maximum benefit specified in the Schedule of Benefits. No additional benefits will be paid under Basic or Major Medical coverage.
36. **Medical Evacuation:** 1) when Hospital Confined for at least five consecutive days; and 2) when recommended and approved by the attending Physician. Benefits will be paid for the evacuation of the Insured to his home country. This benefit is limited to the maximum benefit specified in the Schedule of Benefits. No additional benefits will be paid under Basic or Major Medical coverage.
37. **Supplemental Injury Benefit:** for treatment rendered: 1) on an inpatient or outpatient basis; 2) in a Physician's office or Hospital; and 3) as a result of Injury. This benefit will be paid prior to all other Basic benefits.
38. **Accidental Death and Dismemberment:** the benefits and the maximum amounts are specified in the Schedule of Benefits and endorsement attached hereto, if so noted in the Schedule of Benefits.
39. **Intercollegiate Sports:** the benefits and the maximum amounts are specified in the Schedule of Benefits and endorsement attached hereto, if so noted in the Schedule of Benefits.

**PART VII
EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS**

No benefits will be paid for: a) loss or expense caused by or resulting from; or b) treatment, services or supplies for, at, or related to:

1. Learning disabilities;
2. Biofeedback;
3. Circumcision, except if medically necessary due to Injury, illness, disease or functional congenital disorder;
4. Cosmetic procedures, except cosmetic surgery required to correct an Injury for which benefits are otherwise payable under this policy or for newborn or adopted children; removal of warts, non-malignant moles and lesions;
5. Dental treatment, except for accidental Injury to Sound, Natural Teeth;
6. Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment;
7. Elective abortion;
8. Eye examinations, eye refractions, eyeglasses, contact lenses, prescriptions or fitting of eyeglasses or contact lenses, vision correction surgery, or other treatment for visual defects and problems; except when due to a disease process;
9. Hearing examinations or hearing aids; or other treatment for hearing defects and problems. "Hearing defects" means any physical defect of the ear which does or can impair normal hearing, apart from the disease process;
10. Hirsutism;
11. Immunizations; preventive medicines or vaccines, except where required for treatment of a covered Injury;
12. Injury caused by or resulting from the use of alcohol, intoxicants, hallucinogenics, illegal drugs, or any drugs or medicines that are not taken in the recommended dosage or for the purpose prescribed by the Insured Person's Physician; intoxication is defined and determined by the laws of the state where the loss or cause of the loss was incurred;
13. Injury or Sickness for which benefits are paid or payable under any Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Law or Act, or similar legislation;
14. Injury sustained while (a) participating in any interscholastic, club, intercollegiate, or professional sport, contest or competition; (b) traveling to or from such sport, contest or competition as a participant; or (c) while participating in any practice or conditioning program for such sport, contest or competition;
15. Organ transplants, only those considered experimental are excluded;
16. Pre-existing Conditions, except for individuals who have been continuously insured under the SOMA student insurance policy (200408-1) for at least 12 consecutive months; The Pre-existing Condition exclusionary period will be reduced by the total number of months that the Insured provides documentation of continuous coverage under a prior health insurance policy which provided benefits similar to this policy;
17. Prescription Drugs, services or supplies as follows:
 - a) Therapeutic devices or appliances, including: hypodermic needles, syringes, support garments and other non-medical substances, regardless of intended use; except as specifically provided in the policy;
 - b) Immunization agents, biological sera, blood or blood products administered on an outpatient basis;
 - c) Drugs labeled, "Caution - limited by federal law to investigational use" or experimental drugs;
 - d) Products used for cosmetic purposes;
 - e) Drugs used to treat or cure baldness; anabolic steroids used for body building;
 - f) Anorectics - drugs used for the purpose of weight control;
 - g) Fertility agents or sexual enhancement drugs, such as Parlodel, Pergonal, Clomid, Profasi, Metrodin, Serophene, or Viagra;
 - h) Growth hormones, except when a Medical Necessity; or
 - i) Refills in excess of the number specified or dispensed after one (1) year of date of the prescription;

EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS (Continued)

18. Reproductive/infertility services including but not limited to: family planning; fertility tests; infertility (male or female), including any services or supplies rendered for the purpose or with the intent of inducing conception; premarital examinations; impotence, organic or otherwise; tubal ligation; vasectomy; sexual reassignment surgery; reversal of sterilization procedures;
19. Routine Newborn Infant Care, well-baby nursery and related Physician charges in excess of 48 hours for vaginal delivery or 96 hours for cesarean delivery;
20. Routine physical examinations and routine testing; preventive testing or treatment; screening exams or testing in the absence of Injury or Sickness; except as specifically provided in the policy;
21. Services provided normally without charge by the Health Service of the Policyholder; or services covered or provided by the student health fee;
22. Skeletal irregularities of one or both jaws, including orthognathia and mandibular retrognathia; temporomandibular joint dysfunction; deviated nasal septum, including submucous resection and/or other surgical correction thereof; nasal and sinus surgery;
23. Sleep disorders;
24. Suicide or attempted suicide while sane or insane (including drug overdose); or intentionally self-inflicted Injury;
25. Surgical breast reduction, breast augmentation, breast implants or breast prosthetic devices, or gynecomastia; except as specifically provided in the policy;
26. Treatment in a Government hospital, unless there is a legal obligation for the Insured Person to pay for such treatment;
27. War or any act of war, declared or undeclared; or while in the armed forces of any country (a pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered); and
28. Weight management, weight reduction, nutrition programs, treatment for obesity, surgery for removal of excess skin or fat, and treatment of eating disorders such as bulimia and anorexia. Exception: benefits will be provided for the treatment of dehydration and electrolyte imbalance associated with eating disorders.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR MAMMOGRAPHY

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for screening by Low-dose Mammography for the presence of occult breast cancer according to the following guidelines:

1. A baseline mammogram for women thirty-five to thirty-nine years of age.
2. An annual mammogram for women forty years of age or older.
3. A mammogram at the age and intervals considered medically necessary by the woman's Physician for women under 40 years of age and having a family history of breast cancer or other risk factors.

"Low-dose mammography" means the x-ray examination of the breast using equipment dedicated specifically for mammography, including the x-ray tube, filter, compression device, and image receptor, with radiation exposure delivery of less than one rad per breast for 2 views of an average size breast.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR MASTECTOMY, PROSTHETIC DEVICE AND RECONSTRUCTIVE SURGERY

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for the surgical procedure known as a mastectomy and the prosthetic device or reconstructive surgery incident to the mastectomy.

Benefits for breast reconstruction in connection with a mastectomy shall include:

1. Reconstruction of the breast upon which the mastectomy has been performed;
2. Surgery and reconstruction of the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance; and
3. Prosthesis and treatment for physical complications at all stages of mastectomy, including lymphedemas.

When a mastectomy is performed and there is no evidence of malignancy, benefits will be limited to the cost of the prosthesis or reconstructive surgery to within 2 years after the date of the mastectomy. Benefits for the prosthetic device and reconstructive surgery shall be subject to the Deductible and coinsurance provisions applied to the mastectomy and all other terms and conditions applicable to other benefits under the policy.

"Mastectomy" means the removal of all or part of the breast for medically necessary reasons as determined by a licensed Physician.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING TEST

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for an annual cervical smear or pap smear test and annual Surveillance Tests for ovarian cancer for female Insureds who are At Risk for Ovarian Cancer.

Surveillance Tests for ovarian cancer means annual screening using (1) CA-125 serum tumor marker testing, (2) transvaginal ultrasound, and (3) pelvic examination.

At Risk for Ovarian Cancer means: 1) having a family history (i) with one or more first-degree relatives with ovarian cancer, (ii) of clusters of women relatives with breast cancer, or (iii) of nonpolyposis colorectal cancer, or 2) testing positive for BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutations.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR PROSTATE CANCER SCREENING

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for an annual digital rectal examination and a prostate-specific antigen test upon the recommendation of a licensed Physician for asymptomatic men age 50 and over; African-American men age 40 and over; and men age 40 and over with a family history of prostate cancer.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

EXCESS PROVISION

No benefit of this policy is payable for any expense incurred for Injury or Sickness which is paid or payable by other valid and collectible insurance.

This Excess Provision will not be applied to the first \$100 of medical expenses incurred.

Covered Medical Expenses excludes amounts not covered by the primary carrier due to penalties imposed on the Insured for failing to comply with policy provisions or requirements.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR DIABETES

Benefits will be paid as specified below for an Insured Person with type 1, type 2 or gestational diabetes mellitus for Medically Necessary equipment, supplies, foot care exams, and Diabetes Self-Management Training including medical nutrition therapy when prescribed by a Physician.

Diabetes Self-Management Training:

Diabetes Self-Management Training means instruction in an outpatient setting which enables a diabetic patient to understand the diabetic management process and daily management of diabetic therapy as a means of avoiding frequent hospitalization and complications. Diabetes Self-Management Training includes the content areas listed in the National Standards for Diabetes Self-Management Education Programs as published by the American Diabetes Association, including medical nutrition therapy, which shall have the same meaning ascribed to "medical nutrition care" in the Dietetic and Nutrition Services Practices Act.

Diabetes Self-Management Training, including nutrition education, may be provided as a part of an office visit, group setting or home visit as authorized by the Insured's Physician.

Benefits are limited to the following:

- 1) Up to 3 medically necessary visits to a Physician with expertise in diabetes management upon initial diagnosis of diabetes by the Insured's Physician.
- 2) Up to 2 medically necessary visits to a Physician with expertise in diabetes management upon a determination by an Insured's Physician that a significant change in the Insured's symptoms or medical condition has occurred. A "significant change" means symptomatic hyperglycemia (greater than 250 mg/dl on repeated occasions), severe hypoglycemia (requiring assistance of another person), onset or progression of diabetes, or a significant change in medical condition that would require a significantly different treatment regimen.

Foot Care Exams: Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for regular foot care exams by a Physician.

Durable Medical Equipment: If the policy provides benefits for Durable Medical Equipment, benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for the following medically necessary equipment when prescribed by the Insured's Physician:

- 1) blood glucose monitors;
- 2) blood glucose monitors for the legally blind;
- 3) cartridges for the legally blind; and
- 4) lancets and lancing devices.

Pharmaceuticals and Supplies: If the policy provides benefits for Prescription Drugs, benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for the following medically necessary pharmaceuticals and supplies when prescribed by the Insured's Physician:

- 1) insulin;
- 2) syringes and needles;
- 3) test strips for glucose monitors;
- 4) FDA approved oral agents used to control blood sugar; and
- 5) Glucagons emergency kits.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

ACCIDENTAL DEATH AND DISMEMBERMENT BENEFITS

Loss of Life, Limb or Sight

If such Injury shall independent of disease or bodily infirmity and within 180 days from the date of Injury solely result in any one of the following specific losses, the Insured Person or beneficiary may request the Company to pay the applicable amount below.

Payment under this endorsement when added to payment under the "Basic Medical Expense Benefit" (and under Major Medical, if coverage is afforded under Major Medical) shall not exceed the policy Maximum Benefit.

For Loss Of:

Life	\$10,000
Two or More Members	\$10,000
One Member	\$ 5,000

Member means hand, arm, foot, leg, or eye. Loss shall mean with regard to hands or arms and feet or legs, dismemberment by severance at or above the wrist or ankle joint; with regard to eyes, entire and irrecoverable loss of sight. Only one specific loss (the greater) resulting from any one Injury will be paid.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

PRE-ADMISSION NOTIFICATION

Avidyn should be notified of all Hospital Confinements prior to admission.

1. **PRE-NOTIFICATION OF MEDICAL NON-EMERGENCY HOSPITALIZATIONS:** The patient, Physician or Hospital should telephone 1-877-295-0720 at least five working days prior to the planned admission.
2. **NOTIFICATION OF MEDICAL EMERGENCY ADMISSIONS:** The patient, patient's representative, Physician or Hospital should telephone 1-877-295-0720 within two working days of the admission, or as soon as possible after the patient becomes lucid and able to communicate, to provide notification of any admission due to Medical Emergency.

Avidyn is open for Pre-Admission Notification calls from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. C.S.T., Monday through Friday. Calls may be left on the Customer Service Department's voice mail after hours by calling 1-877-295-0720.

IMPORTANT: Failure to follow the notification procedures will not affect benefits otherwise payable under the policy; however, pre- notification is not a guarantee that benefits will be paid.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR COLORECTAL CANCER TESTS

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for colorectal cancer examinations and laboratory tests for colorectal cancer as prescribed by a Physician, in accordance with the published American Cancer Society guidelines on colorectal cancer screening or other existing colorectal cancer screening guidelines issued by nationally recognized professional medical societies or federal government agencies, including the National Cancer Institute, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the American College of Gastroenterology.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR DENTAL CARE SERVICES

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for anesthetics and associated Hospital or ambulatory facility charges provided in conjunction with dental care for:

1. a child age 6 or under;
2. an individual with a medical condition that requires hospitalization or general anesthesia for dental care; or
3. an individual who is disabled.

This benefit does not cover charges for the dental care itself, only the charges for the anesthesia and associated Hospital or ambulatory facility charges.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

BENEFITS FOR BONE MASS MEASUREMENT/OSTEOPOROSIS

Benefits will be paid the same as any other Sickness for medically necessary bone mass measurement and for the diagnosis and treatment of osteoporosis.

Benefits shall be subject to all Deductible, copayment, coinsurance, limitations, or any other provisions of the policy.

This endorsement takes effect and expires concurrently with the policy to which it is attached, and is subject to all of the terms and conditions of the policy not inconsistent therewith.

POLICY ENDORSEMENT

In consideration of the premium charged, it is hereby understood and agreed that the policy to which this endorsement is attached is amended as follows:

UnitedHealthcare Network Pharmacy Prescription Drug Benefits

Benefits are available for Prescription Drug Products at a Network Pharmacy as specified in the policy Schedule of Benefits subject to all terms of the policy and the provisions, definitions and exclusions specified in this endorsement.

Copayment and/or Coinsurance Amount

For Prescription Drug Products at a retail Network Pharmacy, Insured Persons are responsible for paying the lower of:

- The applicable copayment and/or coinsurance; or
- The Network Pharmacy's Usual and Customary Fee for the Prescription Drug Product.

For Prescription Drug Products from a mail order Network Pharmacy, Insured Persons are responsible for paying the lower of:

- The applicable copayment and/or coinsurance; or
- The Prescription Drug Cost for that Prescription Drug Product.

Supply Limits

Benefits for Prescription Drug Products are subject to supply limits as written by the Physician and the supply limits that are stated in the Schedule of Benefits. For a single copayment and/or coinsurance, the Insured may receive a Prescription Drug Product up to the stated supply limit.

When a Prescription Drug Product is packaged or designed to deliver in a manner that provides more than a consecutive 31-day supply, the copayment and/or coinsurance that applies will reflect the number of days dispensed.

When a Prescription Drug Product is dispensed from a Mail Order Network Pharmacy, the Prescription Drug Product is subject to the supply limit stated in the Schedule of Benefits, unless adjusted based on the drug manufacturer's packaging size, or based on supply limits.

Note: Some products are subject to additional supply limits based on criteria that the Company has developed, subject to its periodic review and modification. The limit may restrict the amount dispensed per Prescription Order or Refill and/or the amount dispensed per month's supply.

The Insured may determine whether a Prescription Drug Product has been assigned a maximum quantity level for dispensing through the Internet at www.uhcsr.com or by calling *Customer Service* at 1-877-417-7345.

If a Brand-name Drug Becomes Available as a Generic

If a Generic becomes available for a Brand-name Prescription Drug Product, the tier placement of the Brand-name Prescription Drug may change, and therefore the copayment and/or coinsurance may change. The Insured will pay the copayment and/or coinsurance applicable for the tier to which the Prescription Drug is assigned.

Notification Requirements

Before certain Prescription Drug Products are dispensed at a Network Pharmacy, either the Insured's Physician, Insured's pharmacist or the Insured is required to notify the Company or our designee. The reason for notifying the Company is to determine whether the Prescription Drug Product, in accordance with our approved guidelines, is each of the following:

- It meets the definition of a Covered Medical Expense.
- It is not an Experimental or Investigational or Unproven Service.

The Company or its designee will contact the Insured's Physician and the notification criteria will be reviewed with the Insured's Physician prior to approval or denial of the medication.

Prescription Drugs Products which require notification are:

Actiq, Anzemet, Avita-Penderm, Avodart, Copegus, Differin-Gladerma, Diflucan, Elidel, Emend, Genotropin, Humatrope, Increlex, Infergen, Intron-A, Iplex, Kytril, Lamisil, Lotronex, Norditropin, Nutropin, Nutropin AQ, Nutropin Depot, PEG-Intron, Pegasys, Proscar, Protopic, Protropin, Provigil, Raptiva, Regranex, Relenza, Retin-A, Retin-A Micro Ortho, Rebetol, Rebetrone, Restasis, Revatio, Roferon, Sporanox, Saizen, Serostim, Tamiflu, Tazorac, Tracleer, Ventavis, Wellbutrin SR, Wellbutrin XL, Zelnorm, Zofran, Zorbive.

If the Company is not notified before the Prescription Drug Product is dispensed, the Insured may pay more for that Prescription Order or Refill. The Prescription Drugs requiring notification are subject to Company periodic review and modification. The Insured may determine whether a particular Prescription Drug requires notification through the Internet at www.uhscr.com or by calling *Customer Service* at 1-877-417-7345.

If the Company is not notified before the Prescription Drug Product is dispensed, the Insured can ask the Company to consider reimbursement after the Insured receives the Prescription Drug Product. The Insured will be required to pay for the Prescription Drug Product at the pharmacy.

When the Insured submits a claim on this basis, the Insured may pay more because they did not notify the Company before the Prescription Drug Product was dispensed. The amount the Insured is reimbursed will be based on the Prescription Drug Cost, less the required copayment and/or coinsurance, and any Deductible that applies.

Benefits may not be available for the Prescription Drug Product after the Company reviews the documentation provided and determines that the Prescription Drug Product is not a Covered Medical Expense or it is an Experimental or Investigational or Unproven Service.

Limitation on Selection of Pharmacies

If the Company determines that an Insured Person may be using Prescription Drug Products in a harmful or abusive manner, or with harmful frequency, the Insured Person's selection of Network Pharmacies may be limited. If this happens, the Company may require the Insured to select a single Network Pharmacy that will provide and coordinate all future pharmacy services. Benefits will be paid only if the Insured uses the designated single Network Pharmacy. If the Insured does not make a selection within 31 days of the date the Company notifies the Insured, the Company will select a single Network Pharmacy for the Insured.

Coverage Policies and Guidelines

The Company's Prescription Drug List ("PDL") Management Committee is authorized to make tier placement changes on its behalf. The PDL Management Committee makes the final classification of an FDA-approved Prescription Drug Product to a certain tier by considering a number of factors including, but not limited to, clinical and economic factors. Clinical factors may include, but are not limited to, evaluations of the place in therapy, relative safety or relative efficacy of the Prescription Drug Product, as well as whether supply limits or notification requirements should apply. Economic factors may include, but are not limited to, the Prescription Drug Product's acquisition cost including, but not limited to, available rebates and assessments on the cost effectiveness of the Prescription Drug Product.

Some Prescription Drug Products are more cost effective for specific indications as compared to others, therefore; a Prescription Drug may be listed on multiple tiers according to the indication for which the Prescription Drug Product was prescribed.

The Company may periodically change the placement of a Prescription Drug Product among the tiers. These changes generally will occur quarterly, but no more than six times per calendar year. These changes may occur without prior notice to the Insured.

When considering a Prescription Drug Product for tier placement, the PDL Management Committee reviews clinical and economic factors regarding Insured Persons as a general population. Whether a particular Prescription Drug Product is appropriate for an individual Insured Person is a determination that is made by the Insured Person and the prescribing Physician.

NOTE: The tier status of a Prescription Drug Product may change periodically based on the process described above. As a result of such changes, the Insured may be required to pay more or less for that Prescription Drug Product. The Prescription Drug List will not be replaced mid-contract year. Please access www.uhcsr.com through the Internet or call *Customer Service* at t 1-877-417-7345 for the most up-to-date tier status.

Rebates and Other Payments

The Company may receive rebates for certain drugs included on the Prescription Drug List. The Company does not pass these rebates on to the Insured Person, nor are they applied to the Insured's Deductible or taken into account in determining the Insured's copayments and/or coinsurance.

The Company, and a number of its affiliated entities, conducts business with various pharmaceutical manufacturers separate and apart from this Prescription Drug Endorsement. Such business may include, but is not limited to, data collection, consulting, educational grants and research. Amounts received from pharmaceutical manufacturers pursuant to such arrangements are not related to this Prescription Drug Benefit. The Company is not required to pass on to the Insured, and does not pass on to the Insured, such amounts.

Definitions

Brand-name means a Prescription Drug: (1) which is manufactured and marketed under a trademark or name by a specific drug manufacturer; or (2) that the Company identifies as a Brand-name product, based on available data resources including, but not limited to, First DataBank, that classify drugs as either brand or generic based on a number of factors. The Insured should know that all products identified as a "brand name" by the manufacturer, pharmacy, or an Insured's Physician may not be classified as Brand-name by the Company.

Chemically Equivalent means when Prescription Drug Products contain the same active ingredient.

Experimental or Investigational Services means medical, surgical, diagnostic, psychiatric, substance abuse or other health care services, technologies, supplies, treatments, procedures, drug therapies or devices that, at the time the Company makes a determination regarding coverage in a particular case, are determined to be any of the following:

- 1) Not approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to be lawfully marketed for the proposed use and not identified in the American Hospital Formulary Service or the United States Pharmacopoeia Dispensing Information as appropriate for the proposed use.
- 2) Subject to review and approval by any institutional review board for the proposed use.
- 3) The subject of an ongoing clinical trial that meets the definition of a Phase 1, 2 or 3 clinical trial set forth in the FDA regulations, regardless of whether the trial is actually subject to FDA oversight.

If the Insured has a life-threatening Injury or Sickness (one which is likely to cause death within one year of the request for treatment) the Company may, in its discretion, determine that an Experimental or Investigational Service meets the definition of a Covered Medical Expense for that Injury or Sickness. For this to take place, the Company must determine that the procedure or treatment is promising, but unproven, and that the service uses a specific research protocol that meets standards equivalent to those defined by the National Institutes of Health.

Unproven Services means services that are not consistent with conclusions of prevailing medical research which demonstrate that the health service has a beneficial effect on health outcomes and that are not based on trials that meet either of the following designs.

- 1) Well-conducted randomized controlled trials. (Two or more treatments are compared to each other, and the patient is not allowed to choose which treatment is received.)
- 2) Well-conducted cohort studies. (Patients who receive study treatment are compared to a group of patients who receive standard therapy. The comparison group must be nearly identical to the study treatment group.)

UnitedHealthcare Network Pharmacy Prescription Drug Benefits *(Continued)*

Decisions about whether to cover new technologies, procedures and treatments will be consistent with conclusions of prevailing medical research, based on well-conducted randomized trials or cohort studies, as described.

If the Insured has a life-threatening Injury or Sickness (one that is likely to cause death within one year of the request for treatment) the Company may, in its discretion, determine that an Unproven Service meets the definition of a Covered Medical Expense for that Injury or Sickness. For this to take place, the Company must determine that the procedure or treatment is promising, but unproven, and that the service uses a specific research protocol that meets standards equivalent to those defined by the National Institutes of Health.

Generic means a Prescription Drug Product: (1) that is Chemically Equivalent to a Brand-name drug; or (2) that the Company identifies as a Generic product based on available data resources including, but not limited to, First DataBank, that classify drugs as either brand or generic based on a number of factors. The Insured should know that all products identified as a "generic" by the manufacturer, pharmacy or Insured's Physician may not be classified as a Generic by the Company.

Network Pharmacy means a pharmacy that has:

- Entered into an agreement with the Company or an organization contracting on our behalf to provide Prescription Drug Products to Insured Persons.
- Agreed to accept specified reimbursement rates for dispensing Prescription Drug Products.
- Been designated by the Company as a Network Pharmacy.

Prescription Drug or Prescription Drug Product means a medication, product or device that has been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and that can, under federal or state law, be dispensed only pursuant to a Prescription Order or Refill. A Prescription Drug Product includes a medication that, due to its characteristics, is appropriate for self-administration or administration by a non-skilled caregiver. For the purpose of the benefits under the policy, this definition includes insulin.

Prescription Drug Cost means the rate the Company has agreed to pay the Network Pharmacies, including a dispensing fee and any applicable sales tax, for a Prescription Drug Product dispensed at a Network Pharmacy.

Prescription Drug List means a list that categorizes into tiers medications, products or devices that have been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. This list is subject to the Company's periodic review and modification (generally quarterly, but no more than six times per calendar year). The Insured may determine to which tier a particular Prescription Drug Product has been assigned through the Internet at www.uhcsr.com or call *Customer Service* at the telephone number on the Insured's ID card 1-800-767-0700.

Prescription Drug List Management Committee means the committee that the Company designates for, among other responsibilities, classifying Prescription Drugs into specific tiers.

Therapeutically Equivalent means when Prescription Drugs can be expected to produce essentially the same therapeutic outcome and toxicity.

Usual and Customary Fee means the usual fee that a pharmacy charges individuals for a Prescription Drug Product without reference to reimbursement to the pharmacy by third parties. The Usual and Customary Fee includes a dispensing fee and any applicable sales tax

Additional Exclusions

In addition to the policy Exclusions and Limitations, the following Exclusions apply:

1. Coverage for Prescription Drug Products for the amount dispensed (days' supply or quantity limit) which exceeds the supply limit.
2. Experimental or Investigational Services or Unproven Services and medications; medications used for experimental indications and/or dosage regimens determined by the Company to be experimental, investigational or unproven.
3. Compounded drugs that do not contain at least one ingredient that has been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and requires a Prescription Order or Refill. Compounded drugs that are available as a similar commercially available Prescription Drug Product. (Compounded drugs that contain at least one ingredient that requires a Prescription Order or Refill are assigned to Tier-2.)
4. Drugs available over-the-counter that do not require a Prescription Order or Refill by federal or state law before being dispensed, unless the Company has designated the over-the-counter medication as eligible for coverage as if it were a Prescription Drug Product and it is obtained with a Prescription Order or Refill from a Physician. Prescription Drug Products that are available in over-the-counter form or comprised of components that are available in over-the-counter form or equivalent. Certain Prescription Drug Products that the Company has determined are Therapeutically Equivalent to an over-the-counter drug. Such determinations may be made up to six times during a calendar year, and the Company may decide at any time to reinstate Benefits for a Prescription Drug Product that was previously excluded under this provision.
5. Any product for which the primary use is a source of nutrition, nutritional supplements, or dietary management of disease, even when used for the treatment of Sickness or Injury.
